TRUE GRIT

On Thursday, I was able to step away from the office to go and watch our secondary boys football game vs. Moscow. It was a very exciting game packed with the intensity, execution, and emotion that comes with competition. However, the thing that stuck with me as I walked back into the school and remains with me today was the grit and effort that I saw out on that field. Quite honestly, if everyone was putting forth the effort I saw on that field into everything that we needed to do...everything would be different. I had to take a moment to step back and look at my own efforts, passions, motivations, and purpose.

The book "Grit" by Angela Duckworth takes a close look at the value of effort and how it is seen within society and success. Over the next few weeks, I would like to focus my writings on this same concept. She discussed four elements of grit that are worthy of reflection. It is easy to see the role that these elements play within education and at school.

1. Interest

The development of interest can take time. It is not always immediate and we often need to look closely into making this happen. Once we find the things that are interesting to us, we need to equally find a way to maintain this interest. Passion builds upon the intrinsic enjoyment that comes from anything we experience in life.

2. The Motivation and Ability to Practice

As the old saying goes, "practice makes perfect." There is no secret to this, just the capacity to not give up.

3. Purpose

Having purpose and feeling like your efforts and work actually matter only increase our passion for the things we do.

4. Hope & Believe

Having a growth mindset lends to the concept of hope. We must believe that our efforts will lead to result. Though the timing is not always the same for everyone, the success equation is clear. This is true in everything we do.



In an interview with NBA superstar Steph Curry, from the Golden State Warriors, he was recently asked about his performance. He said the following, "I mean I try to get better every year. Obviously, that's the mission. That's what we are all trying to do...You use all of the experiences that you've had throughout your career to put that formula together." I know that it might seem odd to start an article with a football match, discuss a book, and finish with an NBA superstar, but I couldn't help but see the similarities across all three, these past couple of days. 

COMMUNICATION STATIONS IN MR. LYONS' IB ECONOMICS CLASS


KNOWING HOW MUCH YOU KNOW

What do you get when you combine nine very smart economics students and eight very difficult economics questions, in a classroom, with a handful of tables and chairs, for 50 minutes?...Give up?... Why, intensive student-centered IB Econ "communication stations", of course!!...

Mr Lyons' first year IB econ students have been working on price elasticity of demand, or the change which occurs in the demand for a good or service when there is a change in price. To deepen understanding and demonstrate mastery of this particular unit, tables are brought together and students are seated in pairs directly across from one another. Questions from the unit are taped to the table at each seat, and the class has had time to review the material as homework. Then, in a sequence of eight roughly 2-3 minute blocks (one for each question), students rotate around the table and teach and learn the answers to each question. With each rotation, one lucky student also takes a break outside of the circle. By the end of the period, each student has rotated eight times, around the entire table, and has learned and taught every question with seven different classmates! No lecture, no worksheets, no presentations. Just a room full of student teachers discussing their way through economics!

This is a great activity for test preparation, for anchoring learning that is not vet quite solid, or even as an alternative assessment. The possibilities are many. Or, as one student commented, "I didn't know I knew so much until I had chance to talk about how much knew!"





ACADEMIC RIGOR

On 3rd of October, the day of the German reunification, **IB German B** students could listen to a first-hand report from a representative from the German Embassy in Kyiv about the exciting time before and after the fall of the Wall dividing families and friends in the two Germanys. After, they watched the movie *Die Klasse Berlin 1961* and relaxed a bit.









IB Mathematical Studies students calculate Campus Space at KIS to be 22,220 m^2! With the use of both Google Earth and a 30-meter tape, two students completed a study of the size of KIS campus, particularly focusing on error calculation. Initial results based on available Google Earth data ended with error results of over 40%. Measuring by hand gave similar results but a reduction in error to 16%. Both of these studies measured student-use land area, excluding boarder fence footprint and outside traffic access.
