Elementary First Day!

We had a great first day of school. Children were getting used to their new classes and new teachers. It was overall a wonderful day! Here are a some new things coming up to be aware of.

We have new cubbies for each elementary level. Level one for the 5 and 6 year olds will be built hopefully by December. We have 7 and 8 year old cubbies and 9 and 10 year old cubbies. They are coordinated with the hall designs painted on the wall. The effect is awesome. The cubbies will help children organize their school materials, keep wet boots on the floor under their coats, and have a place for children to store backpacks. These are an excellent addition to our hallways.

Swimming will be done differently this school year to accommodate the varying needs of our students. The homeroom group will be divided into experienced swimmers and new to swimming swimmers. Then the groups will switch each quarter. Your child will have a half a year of swimming in total but divided between two different sessions. Below are the four different sessions. The pool will be ready for swimming during the week of September 10. Our swimming teacher will be emailing families what they need to bring to be prepared for swimming. We will also make sure that you know which sessions your child will be swimming in. When your child is not swimming, they will be with their homeroom teachers get extra enrichment and support time to help them in reading, writing, and mathematics with their homeroom teachers. Teachers always want to have extra time with your children.

We will enact a new homework policy for our students that will be based on spending a certain amount of time on homework based on the child's age. There will be no homework on breaks. We will focus on literacy-reading and mathematics. We should launch this in a few weeks. Stay tuned!

We will also be adding a robotics/coding teacher for our students ages 6-10 year olds. These extra classes will allow your child to be exposed to computer programming languages and building robots. This is preparing them for the future in technology and actually something that keeps students highly engaged and motivated. The second tech class will continue as before to teach typing, productivity software, and presentation software. Both classes are a well rounded technology program.

Welcome back to another year of KIS Activities. There have been many exciting changes over the summer and we are all eager to get back on the pitch and in the gyms.

Elementary Activities

Our Elementary activities program will once again offer a variety of activities this year. This year 5,6, and 7 year old students will have elementary activities period 8 on Tuesdays and Fridays while 8, 9, and 10 year old students will have activities period 9 Tuesdays and Fridays.

In an effort to offer a more in depth experience for the 8, 9, and 10 year old students, we will have them take part in the same activity each day. This means parents must only sign up for one activity for 8, 9, and 10 year old students. The 5, 6, and 7 year old students will continue to do two different activities each week.

A list of activities will be sent home soon and session 1 sign ups will begin on August 31st and will close on September 16. Please make sure you are able to access your moodle account.

Middle School and Secondary School After School Activities

We have a large number of returning and new activities this year. We will offer CEESA sponsored activities where students will have an opportunity to compete in a CEESA sponsored event and may travel to a CEESA school to compete in the event. We will also have a number of KIS sponsored events such as HS and MS Drama. Students do not have an opportunity to travel but will have an opportunity to put on an amazing show for our KIS community.

One of the most important changes in our MS/HS After School Activity (ASA) program is that students must sign up for these activities on your moodle account. I realize that this was a problem in the past but it is important that parents sign their children up for ASA's or are at least a part of the process to ensure the form has been seen by a parent and information on the form is accurate. If you need assistance with your moodle account please contact moodle help at moodlehelp@ukr.qsi.org.

As usual we ask that all parents indicate three events being held at KIS that they would be able to host. It is important that you are available to host these dates. If all parents participate you should only be asked to host one event. Families who have children participating in multiple events may be asked to host 2 events. If you sign up to host events and at the end of the year were not available to host any of them your child may not be eligible to participate in future ASA's.
